The GeoLite End User License Agreement allows you to use data from GeoLite databases and web services for what we call "Internal Restricted Business Purposes" within your business or organization. <u>Learn more about what we mean by Internal Restricted Business purposes</u>.

The GeoLite End User License Agreement also allows you to use data from GeoLite databases and web services to build applications that are available to users outside your company or organization, or to display that data to users outside your organization, as long as you attribute the data to MaxMind.

Places where we would require attribution

We require you to display the expanded attribution in the following locations:

- Anywhere there is a graphical user interface in which users can view the data, in whatever form, whether in aggregate, as part of analytics or some other kind of dashboard, or as individual alerts/displays.
- In any blog posts, presentations, or other kinds of reports that relied in whole or in part on the data, whether or not that data is displayed in the report.
- In the documentation of relevant derived features for products, services, or code with which the data is distributed, including knowledge bases, README files, and similar.
